(a) In order to carry out responsibilities included in section 21-103, the commission shall have the authority to review and examine the actions of the department with respect to individual incidents after the department has acted. The review extends to both the conduct of the police officers involved in the incident and to those police officers who examine the incident for disciplinary or other purposes.(b)Whenever necessary to carry out its assigned duties, the commissioners shall have the same power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths and require the production of evidence as the city council.(c)The commission's review and examination shall not precede or be concurrent with department actions, but shall occur after the department and city have completed all proceedings related to the incident or action under review, including investigative, criminal, disciplinary, complaint, and other proceedings.

 - ii. Sec. 21-105. – Limitations

(a) The creation and operation of the commission shall not impair the authority and responsibility of the director, the city manager, the mayor, and the city council, as provided in the City Charter.(b)Reports, recommendations, conclusions, and findings produced by or for the commission are not binding, factually or legally, on the city or any part thereof, including the department, the city manager, the city attorney, and the city

council.(c)All investigative files relating to alleged criminal activity or violation of agency rule by an employee are confidential and may not be disclosed to any third party MCL 423.501.
